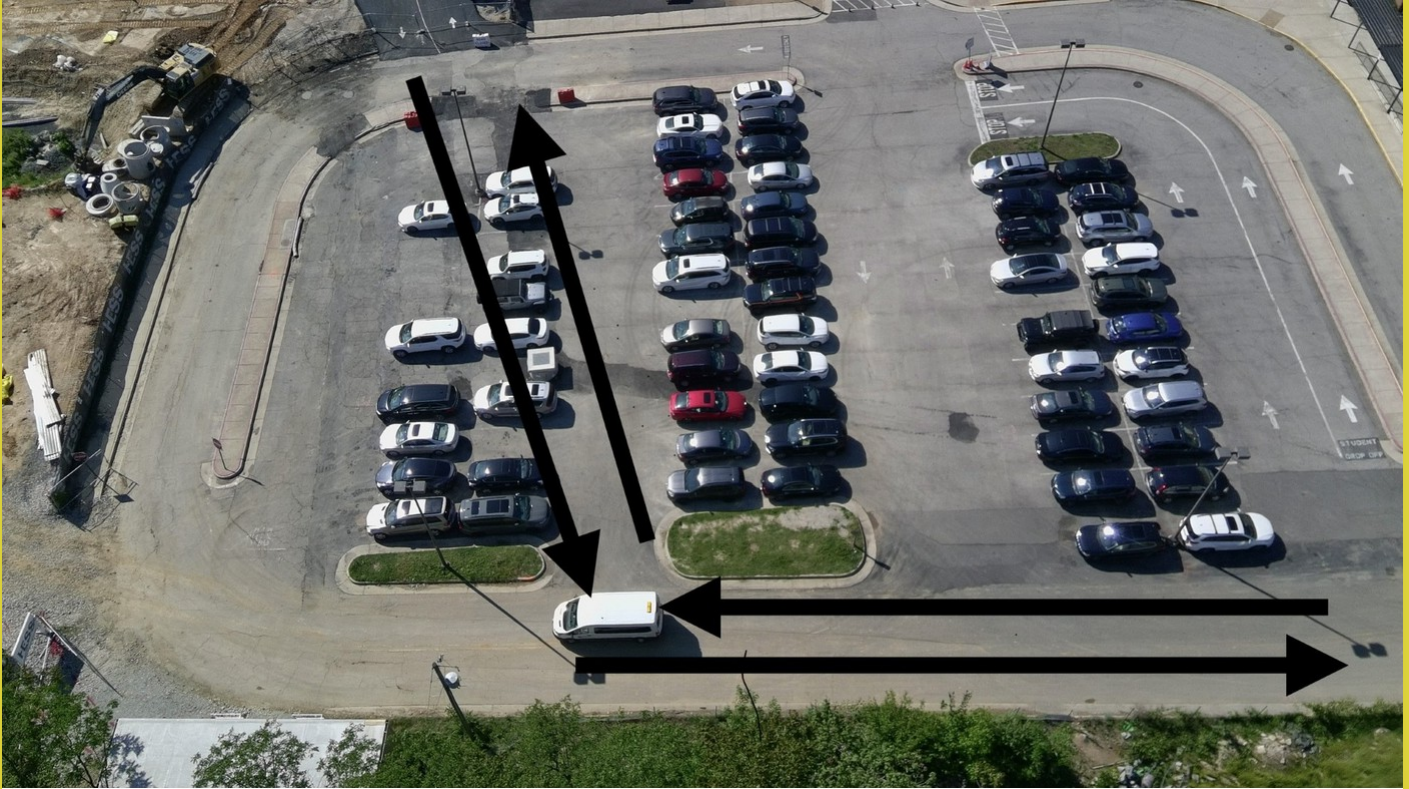
New Kiss and Ride Line

Please take a moment to review the maps below, as we will be implementing a new route for the car rider line beginning Monday morning.

While we prepare to transition to this new process, we ask that you **do not enter the new route until you are directed to do so by school staff**. To ensure a smooth and safe rollout, I will personally lead the way for the first group of cars so that everyone can clearly see how to navigate the new route. As this will be a new experience for all of us, I appreciate your patience and flexibility as we work through this adjustment together.

Our goal is to improve the efficiency and safety of arrival, and your cooperation will help make this transition successful.





How will your child get to and from school next year?

Beginning May 1, 2026, families will be asked to complete their transportation requirement for the 2026-27 school year. Timely submission of this data will allow the Transportation Department to plan more efficient routes and improve on-time service.

The following choices will be available:

- YES - My student will require PWCS bus transportation.
- NO - My student WILL NOT require PWCS bus transportation.
- My student resides within the established walking boundary for our zoned school.
- My student is enrolled in a Specialty Program and will be using an express bus stop.

Submissions and changes will be received until July 31, 2026, at which time final routing will occur. Any requests for service or changes after that date may not be implemented by the first day of school.

News From the Clinic

Medications must be picked up by the last day of school on Friday, June 12, 2026 by 1:00pm. If medication is not picked up by 1:00 p.m., it will be disposed of by school personnel per Regulation 757-4. Medication is not held in the school clinic over summer. Please remember that medication cannot be sent home with a student, it must be picked up by an adult. New Medication Administration Forms and/or Health Treatment Plans are required for each school year. [Updated SOL Practice Items](#)-Updated SOL practice items for Grades 3-8 and End-of-Course Math and Reading tests were recently released by VDOE. These practice items will provide students an opportunity to become familiar with the types of questions that will be administered to assess new standards in reading and math. These practice item sets include new item types that will be field-tested in Spring 2025. Field test items are used to collect data and do not count towards a student's overall test scores.

The Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) released the annual Virginia Standards of Learning (SOL) test results and updated the [School Quality Profile](#). We are well on our way to fully recovering from the pandemic. Occoquan has scored some of the highest scores in Reading and Math. Our African-American scores are what I am most proud of, as we have now surpassed the achievement gap in this category. PWCS will work diligently to support continued academic progress, acceleration, and recovery.

Dismissal Times

Students are no longer allowed to be dismissed from the office between the times of 3:30 and 4:00 due to disruptions to the dismissal process. Construction on the New Building

Construction on Occoquan's new building began recently when they started digging two of the one-hundred-ten holes they will need to dig for our geothermal energy. It has been an exciting time. The students are predicted to move into the building in December 2025. The new building will be located on the grass behind the playground. Construction will officially begin in June 2024, but they will continue to work on some of the other aspects that take a little longer well before that time frame.

Summary:

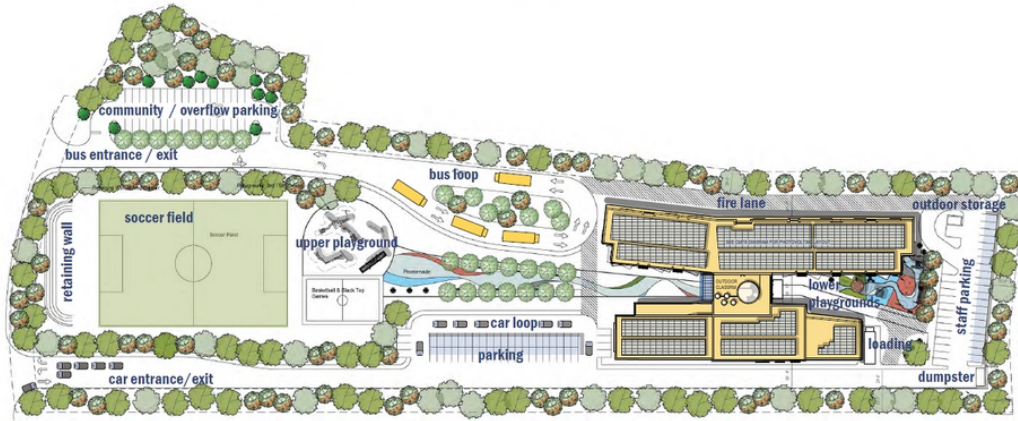
The Building is situated at the far East of the site with the front entrance lobby leading to the heart of the school. In the heart, there is a circular monumental stair with an integrated indoor slide that connects the first two levels. With the Gymnasium and Cafeteria on the first floor and the Media Center on the second floor, all of these spaces are connected by the heart of the school. An academic wing to the north houses most all of the classrooms, except for music and strings which is located across from the media center. The Academic wing is 3 stories tall, while the other portions of the building are 2 stories tall.

There is a secured playground in the East courtyard for Kindergartners. There are spaces for other playgrounds around the site, including in the front closer to the academic side of the building. There will be landscape and playgrounds and athletics fields accessed by the public close to Occoquan Road.

The traffic flow and drop off is controlled by separating the bus loop (on the North) and car loop (on the South) of the campus. There is a walkway in the center of the site to provide the opportunity to connect the front playgrounds and fields to the school in a playful manner.

PARENTAL RIGHT TO INFORMATION ABOUT TEACHERS:

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act, most recently reauthorized as the Every Student Succeeds Act, states that parents in Title I schools have the right to request certain information about their child’s teachers. The information that you have a right to request about your child’s teacher is:

- Whether the teacher has met state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subjects the teacher is teaching.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which state qualification or licensing has been waived.
- The baccalaureate degree major of certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

At Occoquan ES, we are extremely proud of our teachers and paraprofessionals, and are happy to provide you with any of the information above pertaining to your child’s teacher(s). If you have such a request, please call the school at 703.494.2195 and ask for the information you are interested in.

Parental Opt Out of Assessments

Parental Notification of Assessment Opt Out Policies under The Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 According to the Virginia Department of Education, "All students in tested grade levels and courses are expected to participate in Virginia's assessment program, unless specifically exempted by state or federal law or by Board of Education regulations." On December 10, 2015, the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 (ESSA) was signed into law. Section 1112(e)(2) of ESSA states that parents of students in Title I schools have a right to know about state or division policies regarding student participation in any assessments mandated by ESSA, including any policy, procedure, or parental right to opt students out of such assessments. The Commonwealth of Virginia does not currently have an Opt Out policy for SOL assessments. However, Section 22.1-253.13:3.Cof the Code of Virginia states that, "The Board of Education shall not include in its calculation of the passage rate of a Standards of Learning assessment for the purposes of state accountability any student whose parent has decided to not have his child take such Standards of Learning assessment, unless such exclusions would result in the school's not meeting any required state or federal participation rate." Prince William County Public Schools regulations state that, if a parent or guardian decides to not have a student take a state or local assessment, then the person making the request should be informed about the academic consequences that decision could have on the student.
