New Items Added to the Newsletter that are Important

Important Behavioral Announcement

We want to bring to your attention an increasing social media trend involving incidents of "pantsing" that are starting to show up in some of our schools. Pantsing is defined as forcibly removing or pulling down another individual's clothing without their consent. Pantsing is a serious violation of our Code of Behavior and may constitute "criminal sexual contact" under Title IX. "Criminal sexual contact" replaced "fondling" under Title IX and includes a much broader range of unwelcome touching between students. Pantsing not only infringes on personal boundaries but also causes humiliation, distress, and potential harm to the targeted student with lasting negative impact. Our school division is committed to maintaining a safe and equitable environment for all students, and any incidents of pantsing will be subject to disciplinary action and may trigger Title IX investigations. We ask for your partnership in discussing the seriousness of this behavior with your children and reinforcing the importance of respecting others' privacy and dignity. Together, we can foster a culture of respect and safety for every student.

PWCS approves 2026-27 instructional calendar

The Prince William County School Board adopted the 2026-27 instructional calendar. This approved calendar reflects priorities shared by staff and families, offering a three-day Thanksgiving break, two weeks of winter break, and a teacher workday following spring break.

Key Dates for 2026-27

- **First workday for veteran certified staff (195-day contract):** August 17, 2026
- **First day of school for students:** August 24, 2026
- **Winter break:** December 21, 2026 – January 1, 2027 (schools reopen January 4)
- **Spring break:** March 22–29, 2027 (includes teacher workday on March 29)
- **Last day of school for students:** June 17, 2027
- **Last workday for certified staff (195-day contract):** June 21, 2027 (optional teacher workday)

The instructional calendar was developed with [broad input from the PWCS community](#). More than 150 teachers, support staff, principals, central office leaders, families, students, and community partners participated through the calendar committee and advisory groups. Additionally, more than 11,600 community members shared input through the annual school calendar survey, including 4,463 staff members.

The 2026-27 employee work calendars will be published in early 2026. Watch for updates in future newsletters and on Launchpad.

Health Plans and Emergency Medications

If your child has a health condition such as asthma or severe food allergies, it is very important that the school has an updated **Asthma Action Plan** or **Anaphylaxis Plan** and the necessary emergency medication. These medications are kept in the clinic for quick access and also accompany your child on all field trips.

Please make sure to complete the appropriate form for your child's condition and provide medication that is **brand new**, in its **original packaging**, and has a **prescription label** with your child's name and the prescribing doctor. For safety, medication must be **brought to school by an adult**, not by your child.

If you have questions or need forms, please contact the school clinic. Having these items in place helps us keep your child safe every day!

School Quality Profile (AKA: SOL Results)

The Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) released the annual Virginia Standards of Learning (SOL) test results and updated the [School Quality Profile](#). We are well on our way to fully

recovering from the pandemic. Occoquan has scored some of the highest scores in Reading and Math. Our African-American scores are what I am most proud of, as we have now surpassed the achievement gap in this category. PWCS will work diligently to support continued academic progress, acceleration, and recovery.

Construction on the New Building

Construction on Occoquan's new building began recently when they started digging two of the one-hundred-ten holes they will need to dig for our geothermal energy. It has been an exciting time. The students are predicted to move into the building in December 2025. The new building will be located on the grass behind the playground. Construction will officially begin in June 2024, but they will continue to work on some of the other aspects that take a little longer well before that time frame.

Summary:

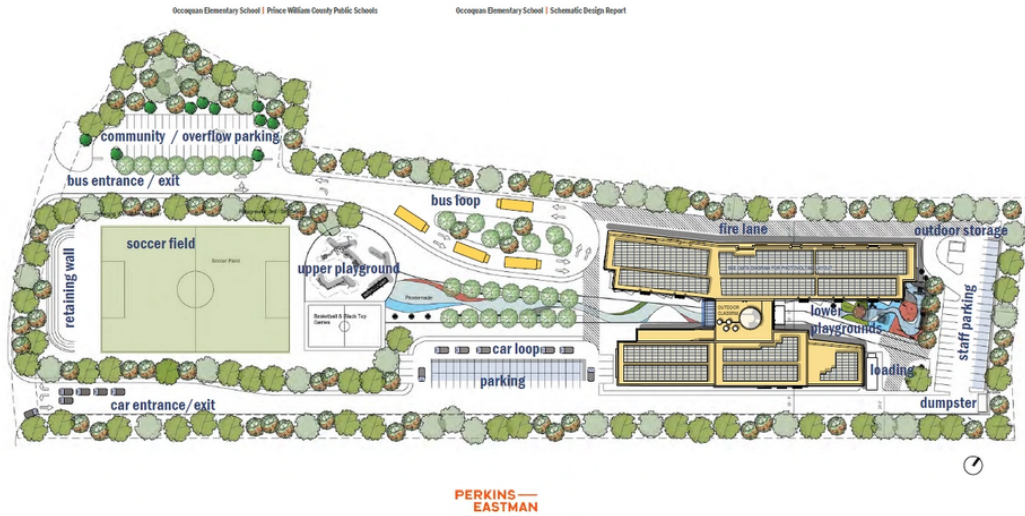
The Building is situated at the far East of the site with the front entrance lobby leading to the heart of the school. In the heart, there is a circular monumental stair with an integrated indoor slide that connects the first two levels. With the Gymnasium and Auditorium on the first floor and the Media Center on the second floor, all of these spaces are connected to the heart of the school. An academic wing to the north houses most all of the classrooms, except for music and string which is located across from the media center. The Academic wing is 3 stories tall, while the other portions of the building are 2 stories tall.

There is a secured playground in the East courtyard for Kindergartners. There are spaces for other playgrounds around the site, including in the front closer to the academic side of the building. There will be landscape and playgrounds and athletics fields accessed by the public close to Occoquan Road.

The traffic flow and drop off is controlled by separating the bus loop (on the North) and car loop (on the South) of the campus. There is a walkway in the center of the site to provide the opportunity to connect the front playgrounds and fields to the school in a playful manner.

PARENTAL RIGHT TO INFORMATION ABOUT TEACHERS:

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act, most recently reauthorized as the Every Student Succeeds Act, states that parents in Title I schools have the right to request certain information about their child's teachers. The information that you have a right to request about your child's teacher is:

- Whether the teacher has met state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subjects the teacher is teaching.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which state qualification or licensing has been waived.

- The baccalaureate degree major of certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

At Occoquan ES, we are extremely proud of our teachers and paraprofessionals, and are happy to provide you with any of the information above pertaining to your child's teacher(s). If you have such a request, please call the school at 703.494.2195 and ask for the information you are interested in.

Parental Opt Out of Assessments

Parental Notification of Assessment Opt Out Policies under The Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 According to the Virginia Department of Education, "All students in tested grade levels and courses are expected to participate in Virginia's assessment program, unless specifically exempted by state or federal law or by Board of Education regulations." On December 10, 2015, the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 (ESSA) was signed into law. Section 1112(e)(2) of ESSA states that parents of students in Title I schools have a right to know about state or division policies regarding student participation in any assessments mandated by ESSA, including any policy, procedure, or parental right to opt students out of such assessments. The Commonwealth of Virginia does not currently have an Opt Out policy for SOL assessments. However, Section 22.1-253.13:3.Cof the Code of Virginia states that, "The Board of Education shall not include in its calculation of the passage rate of a Standards of Learning assessment for the purposes of state accountability any student whose parent has decided to not have his child take such Standards of Learning assessment, unless such exclusions would result in the school's not meeting any required state or federal participation rate." Prince William County Public Schools regulations state that, if a parent or guardian decides to not have a student take a state or local assessment, then the person making the request should be informed about the academic consequences that decision could have on the student.

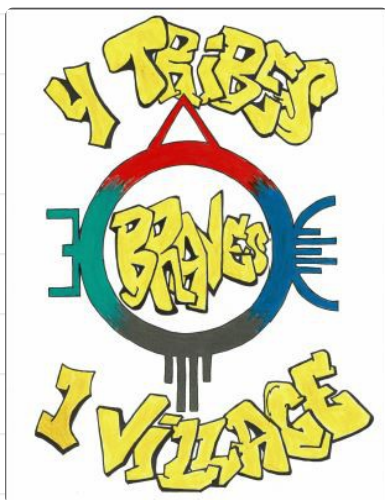
